The praise hides the real cruncher.

We have not yet started on the QGC conditions, I understood the priority was Santos; and we are still tidying up outstanding bits of that advice.

I have been consistently advised by DIP that QGC was down the track and that DIP had not even started writing their report. We have had no warning for this sudden request for immediate provision of QGC conditions or any notice about a meeting tomorrow. An email from Phil Dash on Saturday is not at all helpful. I was hoping that we might have got some feedback from the DG on our proposed "final advice" to know whether we are on the right track. Our regular meetings with QGC have led to a series of offers by QGC to provide more detailed information in some areas, much of which is still to be provided.

In addition we have the APLNG comments on their EIS due today, for which we were given less than 4 weeks to deal with 10,000 pages.

Once again I am faced with a physically impossible request, along with the other 80 EIS projects that are starting to slip.

Hi Denis,

Please find attached information and advice on the proposed changes to the EP Act regarding CSG water management. It is likely that the South-East Queensland Water (Distribution and Retail Restructuring) and Other Legislation Amendment Bill 2010 will be passed shortly.

You may wish to use the advice in the Coordinator-General's Evaluation Report or modify the report to highlight the proposed changes.

To accommodate these changes, DERM recommends that the following amendments be made to Condition 3 - Coal Seam Gas Water Management Plan and Condition 4 - Brine Management Strategy of Appendix 8 Environmental Conditions - Gas Field:

Condition 3 - Coal Seam Gas Water Management Plan

The proponent shall provide to the CG for review a Coal Seam Gas Water Management Plan (CWMP) to incorporate provisions which meet the requirements of:

- a) Section 310D of the Environmental Protection Act 1994, or otherwise amended by the South-East Queensland Water (Distribution and Retail Restructuring) and Other Legislation Amendment Bill 2010;
- b) DERM Guideline: Preparing an environmental management plan (EM Plan) for Coal Seam Gas (CSG) activities;
- c) DERM Guideline: Approval of coal seam gas water for beneficial use;
- d) the Environmental Protection (Waste Management) Regulation 2000;
- e) DERM Healthy Headwaters study: Characterisation of salinity limits related to the use of CSG water for irrigation (DERM, January 2010).

The Coal Seam Gas Water Management Plan is to be submitted to the Coordinator-General for review prior to the issue of environmental authorities for a petroleum tenure.

The Coal Seam Gas Water Management Plan is to be provided to DERM as a component of the EM Plan submitted with applications for environmental authorities.

Condition 4 - Brine Management Strategy

The proponent shall provide a Brine Management Strategy that includes:

- a) Section 310D of the Environmental Protection Act 1994, or otherwise amended by the South-East Queensland Water (Distribution and Retail Restructuring) and Other Legislation Amendment Bill 2010;
- b) A strategy consistent with the DERM Guideline: Preparing an environmental management plan (EM Plan) for Coal Seam Gas (CSG) activities; and
- c) any plan for reinjection of brine or untreated water; and
- d) any plan for the utilization of salts extracted from associated water; and
- e) an assessment of the potential impacts of options considered and appropriate mitigation measure for the preferred option.

The Brine Management Strategy is to be submitted to the Coordinator-General for review prior to the issue of environmental authorities for petroleum tenure.

Denis,

I have discussed with Lindsay and Steven Tarte an achievable time for DERM to provide you with conditions for discussion with GPC.

By cob Thursday we could provide a revised draft of DERM's final advice (that will still need our DG sign off before going outside DIP) and a separate document with just the draft conditions for discussion with QGC. While these will be based on those recommended for Santos, they will differ in a number of areas. Achieving this time frame will be dependent on delaying any proposed meetings with QGC until we have finished this exercise. We cannot go to briefings and detailed planning meetings, and finish our documentation. We will also run this week with what we already have from QGC, not what they have offered to provide over the next couple of weeks. Amendments, briefings and further presentations and discussions can occur once we provided you with the aforementioned.

I hope this will move us ahead to a satisfactory outcome within a reasonable timeframe.

Dear Colleagues

Please find attached a discussion paper entitled "Effects of Mining on Nature Refuges" and attachments from the Department of Environment and Resource Management.

This discussion paper proposes three options to resolve conflicts between nature refuge areas and resource development activities (including mining, and petroleum & gas extraction); to seek endorsement of the preferred policy option to create a new form of nature refuge to allow for more secure protection of significant biodiversity values on private land managed for conservation; and, to seek approval to consult on the preferred policy options with specific stakeholders.

Three options have been developed to provide a range of possible responses of varying policy strength:

(1) Maintain existing mechanisms for assessing and managing impacts of conflicting land uses in Nature Refuges. (Status quo).

(2) Prohibit all new mining related activities, including new exploration in Nature Refuges in line with national parks. (Total prohibition).

(3) Create an additional form of nature refuge that provides the option for high conservation value nature refuges to be protected from resource development activities (Protection of significant nature refuges)

It would be appreciated if you could arrange for the appropriate officer/s to review the document and provide comments or a NIL response to policy.coordination@dip.qld.gov.au by no later than MIDDAY Wednesday 5 May, 2010.

Please ensure the name, title and contact details of the officer who provided the comments are also included within your response.

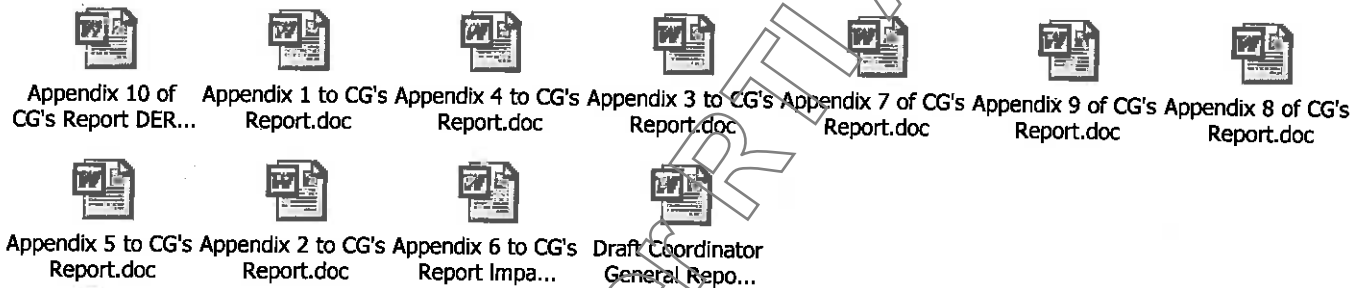
